



Immigration: Know Your Rights

- You have the right to stay silent.
- You do not have to answer questions.
- You can say, “I wish to remain silent.”
- Do not open your door.
- To come into your home, U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) must have a warrant signed by a judge.
- You can say, “I do not give you permission to enter my home.”
- You have the right to talk to a lawyer. You can say, “I need to speak to my lawyer.”
- Do not sign anything before you talk to a lawyer.

Size/Strength (How many officers?
How many vehicles?)

Actions/Activity (What are they doing?)

Location (Where are they?)

Uniform (What are they wearing?)

Time/Date

Equipment (Do they have batons, guns, or vests?)
